# In Stitches Group



#### THE GOLDEN RULE. "Do unto others as you wish them to do unto you".

It is more than a Biblical statement, it is a command from Jesus Christ Himself. Mathew 7:12, says, "whatever you wish that others will do unto you, do so to them, for this is the Law, and the Prophet ". Jesus' command comes in the context of the Sermon on the Mount, in a section where He discusses LOVING YOUR ENEMIES. The natural instinct is to hate your enemy, wish them bad, and wishing bad things to happen to them.

Jesus says that His Children should live differently, from the people of the world; we are to love our enemies. The good rule has always been a basic part of the Bible's message. In Mathew, when asked what the greatest commandment is, Jesus replied, "love the Lord your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind, this is the first and greatest commandment" and the second is, "love your neighbor as yourself". All the laws and the Prophet hang on these two commitments.

In John 13:34-35, the night of His arrest, Jesus said to His disciples "a new commandment I give to you, "love one another, as I have loved you, so you must love one another, by this, people will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another."

Jesus's love for us is perfect, unchanging, and sacrificial, our capacity to love others the way Jesus commended comes only from our experience of the Holy Spirit.

Christ's central command in the social arena was a rousing call that we actively seek to ease the sufferings of others. To go above, and beyond in our love for others. This is clearly seen in His command, to love your neighbor as yourself. He has given it a new context of, go out of the way to do everything in your power to ease the sufferings of your fellow man, even if he or she is a stranger. This is indeed, what is required of us as Children of God!

In Luke 10:27-37, Jesus agrees with a man that indeed the greatest commandment is towards our neighbors, is to love them as we love ourselves. But the man asked, who is my neighbor? Jesus responded by telling the story of the Good Samaritan, who was robbed, and beaten half to death. This man that society considered enemy, spent a lot of time, effort, and money, to make absolutely sure the wounded man was well recovered. He went an extra mile.

Christ is commanding us to come out of our comfort zones, go an extra mile to love one another. We have much to do.
