


In Stitches Group

Bits and Pieces

Festive Potato Salad

3 large cooked potatoes
2 TBS. vegetable oil
1 TBS. vinegar
1 tsp. salt
½ cup sliced ripe olives – well drained
1 ½ cups finely shredded cabbage
¼ cup chopped dill pickle
½ cup coarsely grated carrot
2 TBS. diced pimento
2TBS. diced green bell pepper
2 TBS. diced onion
½ cup chopped celery
2 1/3 cups mayonnaise (I prefer using just 2 cups)
1 tsp. mustard
Black pepper to taste.

Prepare the potatoes like you are making mashed potatoes except dice them instead of chopping them in big chunks. After cooking the potatoes, drain well, blend oil, vinegar, salt and sprinkle over the potatoes. Stir this up and let stand to cool. Combine olives, potatoes, cabbage, pickle carrots, pimento, green pepper, onion and celery. Blend mayonnaise, mustard and pepper and pour over salad tossing lightly then chill.

Lectionary Lessons for month, 2020


<p>April 5, 2020: Sunday of the Passion, Palm Sunday</p> <p>Isaiah 50:4-9a Psalm 31:9-16 Philippians 2:5-11 Matthew 28:11-54</p>	<p>In fulfilment of scripture and obedience to God's will, Jesus goes to the cross so that a new covenant in his blood may bring forgiveness of sins. Even the soldiers who crucify him recognize him to be the Son of God.</p>
<p>April 9, 2020: Maundy Thursday</p> <p>Exodus 12:1-14 Psalm 116:1-2, 12-19 I Corinthians 11:23-26 John 13:1-17, 31b-35</p>	<p>The Story of the last supper in John's gospel recalls a remarkable event not mentioned elsewhere: Jesus performs the duty of a slave, washing the feet of his disciples and urging them to do the same for one another</p>
<p>April 10, 2020: Good Friday – Tenebrae</p> <p>Isaiah 52:13-53:12 Psalm 22 Hebrews 10:16-25 John 18:1-19:42</p>	<p>On Good Friday, the story of Jesus' passion – from his arrest to his burial – is read in its entirety from the gospel of John</p>
<p>April 12, 2020: Resurrection of Our Lord, EASTER SUNDAY</p> <p>Acts 10:34-43 Psalm 118:1-2, 14-24 Colossians 3:1-4 John 20:1-18</p>	<p>John's gospel describes the confusion and excitement of the first Easter: The stone is moved, disciples race back and forth, and angels speak to a weeping woman. Then, Jesus himself appears.</p>
<p>April 19, 2020: Second Sunday of Easter</p> <p>Acts 2:14a, 22-32 Psalm 16 I Peter 1:3-9 John 20:19-31</p>	<p>The risen Jesus appears to his disciples, offering them a benediction, a commission, and the gift of the Holy Spirit. But one of their number is missing, and his unbelief prompts another visit from the lord</p>
<p>April 26, 2020: Third Sunday of Easter</p> <p>Acts 2: 15a, 36-41 Psalm 116:1-4, 12-19 I Peter 1:17-23 Luke 24:13-35</p>	<p>The imagery of exile is used to help the readers of this letter understand that they are strangers in a strange land. Christians no longer belong to this age. Through the death of Christ we belong to God, so that our focus, faith, and hope are no longer on such things as silver or gold.</p>
