PECAN PIE COBBLER

1 box refrigerated Pie Crusts (Pillsbury 14.1)

2 1/2 cups light corn syrup

2 1/2 cups packed brown sugar

1/2 cup melted butter

4 tsps. Vanilla

6 eggs, lightly beaten

2 cups chopped pecans

Cooking spray

2 cups Pecan Halves

Heat oven to 425 degrees. Lightly grease a $13'' \times 9''$ glass baking dish. Remove one pie crust from pkg. and roll out to fit baking dish. Trim edges.

In a large bowl, combine corn syrup, butter, vanilla & eggs. Whisk until well combines. Stir in chopped pecans.

Spoon half of filling into crust

Remove second crust from pkg., roll out to fit baking dish. Place the crust on top of the filling. Lightly spray with cooking spray.

Bake 14-15 minutes or until browned. Remove from oven.

Reduce oven temp to 350 and carefully spoon remaining pecan filling over crust. Arrange the pecan halves over the top and bake 30 minutes or until the center is set. Let cool for 15-20 minutes before serving.

Reformation Sunday is October 31. Wear Red. Martin Luther made a change of the Lutheran religion. Luther believed you are saved by Grace. He wrote 95 theses against indulgences. The teachings of the Reformation, the good news of God's gift of salvation in Christ Jesus, continued to spread through Germany and all of Europe. Luther wrote his Small Catechism for use in homes and schools. Included were the Ten Commandments, the Apostle's Creed, the Lord's Prayer and teaching on Baptisms, Confession and Holy Communion. Luther later delived on basis Christian teachings for the Large Catechism for the instruction of pastors,
