theran Churches, and through a true sense of loving Christian unity, Faith Lutheran Church (1437 SW Parkway) has invited Trinity to celebrate their Christmas Eve service with them on December 24th at 7:00pm. Faith's Pastor Ernest Barr has asked me to take part in this celebration, so Trinity's service on Christmas Eve will be in the Faith Lutheran Church sanctuary! I would love to see you there!

This month, during the season of Advent, we sing songs proclaiming God's steadfast love. We sing of the hope and promise of the soon-coming Savior. It is wonderful to sing praises to our loving Creator God, who came as a child, walked the Earth in human form, and died to redeem us, all out of love for us-His creation! 
